**Register for 'Vision After Brain Injury' Webinar**

**Background:**

Join the Health and Human Services Commission Office of Acquired Brain Injury for a webinar on August 10, 2023, from 12-1:00 p.m. This webinar is open to the public, including those impacted by brain injury and vision loss.

**Key Details:**

Changes to vision after an acquired brain injury are common. Studies show that approximately 90% of brain injury survivors can experience changes to their vision. These changes may require specialized treatment and sometimes go undetected due to complications of other medical conditions.

Dr. Jenalyn Jotie, OD, FAOO, will present on vision after brain injury and provide education on types of vision loss, visual mechanical skills, and visual processing changes, including visual field changes, double vision, blurry vision, and headaches. Dr. Jotie will also review evidence-based interventions utilized in vision rehabilitation. Dr. Jotie is a traumatic brain injury survivor who has had the unique firsthand experience of overcoming vision changes after a brain injury through vision rehabilitation.
