| Mohs Micrographic<br>Surgery Policy,<br>Professional            | November 1,<br>2022   | <ul> <li>UnitedHealthcare has revised the Mohs Micrographic Surgery Policy as follows:</li> <li>The multiple procedure reduction will no longer apply when a Mohs surgical procedure and a separate procedure to repair the wound are performed on the same date of service by different provider primary specialties (as identified by UnitedHealthcare) within the same medical group.</li> <li>Multiple procedure reductions will continue to apply to the same provider performing multiple procedures on the same date of service.</li> </ul> |
