Modifier Policy, Facility	California, Colorado, District of Columbia, Florida, Hawaii, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, Missouri, New York, North Carolina, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, Virginia, Washington, Wisconsin	 The new Modifier Policy, Facility, will be effective for dates of service on or after June 1, 2023. In alignment with the American Medical Association (AMA) and the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS), modifier 53 is not appropriate for reporting on a UB-04 claim form. Therefore, United Healthcare Community Plan will deny the claim line reported with modifier 53 on outpatient facility claims. 	06/01/2023
