Pregnant and New Moms	Babyscripts	Pregnant members can enroll in Babyscripts, an app with information on nutrition, exercise, newborn care, pregnancy, and more. They can earn up to \$75 in rewards, for completing specified appointments: \$25 for enrolling, \$25 for prenatal visit, \$25 for post-partum visit.	Download the Babyscripts app from the Apple or Google Play Stores, find "UnitedHealthcare Community Plan of Kansas", and sign-up with Member ID number.
	Blood pressure monitor	Pregnant members with diagnosis of hypertension or preeclampsia can get a blood pressure monitor.	Contact member services: 1-877-542-9238
	First trimester prenatal exam reward	Pregnant members completing first prenatal exam within the first trimester (or 42 days from enrollment) can earn a \$75 debit card, to use at specific retailers for health related items.	Once a member completes activity, a card is mailed or balance is added to existing card. To activate card o check balance, call 1-888-682-2400 or go to mybenefitscenter.com
More Coverage	Adult dental coverage	Any member ages 21 and over are eligible for added dental benefits, like screenings, exams, x-rays, and specialty preventative treatments up to \$500 per year.	Members work with provider in the UnitedHealthcare dental provider network. Contact member services for assistance: 1-877-542-9238
	Additional vision	Adult members over 21 can get an additional \$60 once a year, to upgrade their frames.	Member can ask Vision provider. Providers wanting to participate can work with UnitedHealthcare Provider Services.
Social Consideration and Wellness	24 round trip rides anywhere needed	Members can get up to 24 total round-trip rides per year to cover for example: getting to the pharmacy, grocery store, food bank, WIC, prenatal classes, local community activities support group meetings, job interviews, job training, shopping for work clothes, career counseling, early childhood education programs or any that remove transportation barriers to access services.	Members can contact ModivCare: 1-877-796-5847 Member Services: 1-877-542-9238 to set up a ride at least three days before the need.
	Bus passes	Members in in Wyandotte, Johnson, Sedgwick, and Shawnee counties can get up to \$25 in bus passes, per year.	Contact member services: 1-877-542-9238
	Dining with Diabetes	Members with a diagnosis of Type 2 Diabetes or their caregivers are eligible to attend Dining with Diabetes classes through K-State Research and Extension at no cost.	Contact member services: 1-877-542-9238
	Educational advancement	Provide adult members with education such as GED, Coding Classes, Resume Writing Workshops, & ESL (English as a Second Language). Covers up to \$200.	Contact member services: 1-877-542-9238
	Healthy activity for all	All members can access a \$50 activity or program at participating organizations such as YMCA, Boys and Girls Clubs, and parks and recreation locations in Kansas or receive a fitness kit for healthy activities at home.	Contact member services: 1-877-542-9238
	Healthy rewards	Earn Debit Card Rewards for completing things like your annual health assessment and well-child visits. Use rewards for hundreds of healthy items. Reward amounts are \$10 to \$75 annually.	Once a member completes activity, a card will be mailed or balance will be added to existing card. 	Help with getting free cell phone service	Free smartphone with unlimited messaging for members 18 years and older. Max one device per household that qualifies to federal eligibility criteria.	Contact member services: 1-877-542-9238
	Post-Discharge Mom's Meals	Members can get 14 meals (two meals per day, for seven days) if discharged from a medical facility, have mobility needs, no family support to assist with food access, and are at risk for readmission due to nutritional issues. Benefit available within 30 days of discharge.	Contact member services: 1-877-542-9238 or work with your discharge planner
	Nutrition	Members who complete the Create Better Health SNAP Education Classes will receive a food journal and cooking item valued at \$50. Information about classes can be found here: k-state.edu/ks-snaped/free-classes.html	Member registers for classes, attends, and at completion, contact member services: 1-877-542-9238
	School supplies	Members who are in foster care can receive a school supply box per year.	Members can contact their foster care agency to receive school supply box.
	Weighted blankets	Members who are in foster care or on the Autism or SED Waivers can get a weighted blanket to provide support for anxiety. Member can request one of three weight options: Light/Medium/Heavy. One blanket per member annually.	Contact member services: 1-877-542-9238

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Technology Programs	On My Way (OMW) program	Young adult members can access this website, that helps prepare them for adult life. OMW teaches skills like managing money, getting housing, finding job training, and applying for college.	Members can access at www.UHComw.com
	Pyx Health	Members 18 and older can access 24/7 support and companionship using the Pyx Health mobile application. This app helps combat social isolation and loneliness with access to compassionate people who listen and connect them to resources.	Members can sign up by going to www.HiPyx.com or search Pyx Health in the Apple or Google Play stores.
	Sanvello Premium	Self-care, coaching, therapy, and peer support for dealing with stress, anxiety, and depression are available to all members through the premium version of the Sanvello app or Sanvello.com	Members can sign up at Sanvello.com or download the app in Apple or Google Play sotres. Members enter their Member ID to upgrade to premium.
Community Programs	Mental Health First Aid training	Members and other individuals can take an 8-hour course on how to identify, understand, and respond to signs of mental illnesses and substance use. Participants learn a five-step action plan to help an individual connect with professional, peer, social, and self-help care. Trainings are offered in English and Spanish. 	Seeking Safety Trainings	Members, individuals, peers, and providers can participate in an 8-hour facilitator training course on 25 different evidence based safe coping skills, to help adults with trauma and/or substance use. 	Community baby showers	Members are welcome to attend UnitedHealthcare sponsored community events for pregnant and new moms to learn about health and wellness for themselves and their babies. 	Sesame Street Food for Thought	Families with children age 2 to 8 can to participate in this presentation, that uses Sesame Street characters to teach how to eat healthy on a budget. Waivers	Dentures	Effective 7/1/23 Dentures are covered by Medicaid when medically necessary as determined through Dental prior authorization approval	
	Home Helper catalog	Members on the PD, FE, BI, TA, & I/DD waiver can select a product from a catalog of items that help with home safety or home assistance. Members can get one order per year. Total value cannot exceed \$50.	Members work with Care Coordinator to view the catalog and select the items to order.
	Internet access	Members on the FE, PD, I/DD or Autism waivers may be invited to get internet services covered, as incentive for completing specific health activity.	Member needs to work with Care Coordinator.
	Pest control	Waiver members who own their home can work with their care coordinator to set up pest control services, up to \$250 max annually.	Member needs to work with Care Coordinator.
	Respite care	Up to 40 hours of Respite Care for I/DD waiver members receiving supported home care or home based services.	Member needs to work with Care Coordinator.
	Wellness calendar	FE waiver members will be mailed a calendar at the beginning of each year to track their doctor appointments, medications, and social events.	FE members receive calendar in the mail. Can contact Care Coordinator if they haven't receive it.
