The number of babies born with congenital syphilis (CS) has been steadily rising. In response, the Texas Department of State Health Services created a consultation hotline for physicians and other clinical providers caring for women and infants with acquired or congenital syphilis.

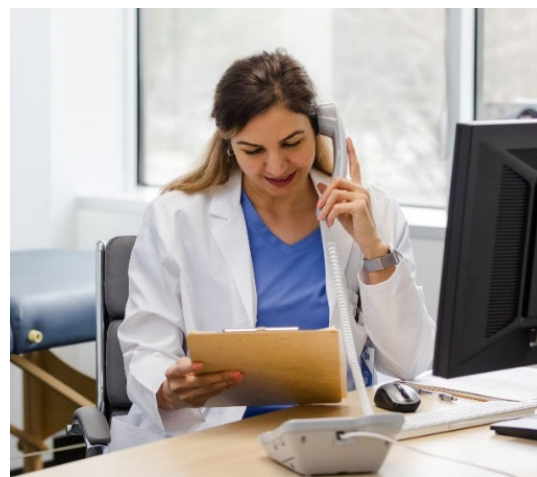
The hotline offers expert clinical guidance and referrals to regional resources to prevent congenital syphilis in Texas. Callers can speak directly with a nurse or one of our physician consultants for case-specific guidance.

Information to have ready when you call:

- Provider details (name, title, phone, email, clinic/hospital)
- Patient identification (name, date of birth, race/ethnicity)
- Pregnancy or delivery status (including gestational age)
- Key clinical information (pertinent history, diagnoses, allergies, and exam findings)



You do **not** need to have all the information above to call the hotline.
