If you receive an email that you believe is a phishing attempt, please send the original email **as an attachment** to <u>csoc-alerts@hhs.texas.gov</u>. HHSC will work with the appropriate entities to block, and when appropriate, request the website be taken down.

As a reminder, if you receive an unexpected or suspicious email, don't click on the links, open the attachments, or accept the invitation.
